No Losses with Recent Visa Debit Card Compromise

In February many of our customers received new Visa Check Cards and PINs (Personal Identification Number). The new cards and PINs were issued to each Visa Check Card customer that had a *potential* for his or her card number to be compromised. The compromise did not happen at The Bank of Tescott. The compromise happened at a third-party processor that processes credit and debit card transactions for multiple merchants. At this time three men have been arrested in connection with the compromise and more arrests are expected.

No personal information was compromised and no customer of The Bank of Tescott experienced any loss due to the compromise. The Bank of Tescott would like to thank all of our Visa Check Card customers for their patience and understanding during this time.
